- □ Duration: 2009 to 2013 (€ 55 million)
- Four areas of action:
  - ensuring public awareness
  - fighting against illegal content and tackling harmful conduct online
  - promoting a safer online environment
  - establishing a knowledge base

## Coordination of "the programme"

- The Commission ensures the coordination of different stakeholder groups through: a Coordination Group representing all the networks co-funded by the programme focus groups including Safer Internet projects, industry, parents' associations, teachers' representatives etc
- Meets twice a year
